

Florida International University Financial Aid Statistics

Federal financial aid investments at FIU make a critical impact in South Florida, allowing our region to gain new college-educated professionals as these individuals work to pursue their dreams.

2018-2019 Highlights

- Over 23,514 FIU students received Pell grants in 2018-2019
 - This represents approximately 46% of our total student undergraduate population.
- Over 57% of Pell recipients receive the maximum award based on an expected family contribution of \$0.
- Sixty-two percent or 11,920 of Pell recipients earned a B average or higher (3.0+) in Fall 2018 (based on Cumulative GPA).
- Sixty-nine percent or 13,292 of Pell recipients are enrolled full time at FIU during Fall 18.
- 45% of FIU students receiving Pell are First Generation in college.
- FIU had 3,127 students who qualified for Florida Student Assistant Grant (FSAG) but didn't get an award due to lack of funding.
- In South Florida, 138,803 students receive Pell Grants at the sum of \$552,918,385.
- Total unmet financial need for FIU's enrolled undergraduates who filed a FAFSA and received at least one type of AID was just over \$284 Million (not including summer) for 2018-10 Source
- 20,218 students currently receive Stafford Loans
- \$19,923 is the average loan indebtedness (2018 CDS)

Work Study & Other Federal Aid Programs

- 548 students take part in the Federal Work Study Program
- 19,564 students receive funds from the Federal Direct Loan Program (FDLP)
- 4,339 students are recipients of the Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (SEOG)

Default Rate

- Percentage of FIU borrowers defaulted on their Federal student loans within three years of entering repayment= 5.3% (National Average= 10.8%)
